

ASTLEY

Is a township and village in the Parish, Union and County Court District of Leigh, and about three miles east therefrom, $10\frac{1}{4}$ from Manchester, seven from Bolton, and one from Tyldesley. The population of the township in 1861 was 2,109, and in 1871 2,022. The area is 2,628 statute acres. The soil is clayey, the subsoil rocky, the district is level, and the land chiefly pasture; George Nugent Ross Weatherall, Esq., of Astley Hall, is Lord of the Manor. The church of St. Stephen is a plain brick building in the modern style of architecture, and has been enlarged three times, viz., in 1834, 1842, and 1847, and will seat about 1,000 persons. It has nave, aisles, chancel, porch, organ, square embattled tower and one bell. The living is a perpetual curacy, of the annual value of about £400; with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Leigh; the Rev. Alfred Hewlett, D.D., is the vicar. The Wesleyans and Unitarians have chapels here, with Sunday schools attached. There is a National School and a Free Grammar School (Mort's) for 24 scholars. There are collieries and a large cotton mill in the township. The Bridgewater Canal passes through the village; and there is a Station here on the Liverpool and Manchester section of the London and North-western line, which runs through the southern part of the township.

BURTON WOOD, COLLINS GREEN, DALLAM & BEWSEY.

BURTON WOOD is a township containing an area of 3,800 statutes acres, and a population in 1861 of 990, and in 1871, 1,112. It is in the parish of Warrington, about five miles north-west therefrom, and four south-east from St. Helens, in West Derby hundred, Union, county court district and rural deanery of Warrington, archdeaconery of Liverpool, and diocese of Chester. The church is a brick building, with a tower, chancel, bell, and organ. The living is in the gift of the rector of Warrington. The Rev. William Garnet Thomas, M.A., of Trinity College, Cambridge, is the present vicar. There is a voluntary contribution, usually amounting to £20 per annum, given in cloth to the deserving poor on St. Thomas's Day. There is an Endowed School for boys and girls, average number 50, and a Sunday school is held at the day school.

COLLIN'S GREEN is a village, with a railway station.

DALLAM and BEWSEY are both in the township of Burton Wood. At Dallam earthenware and tiles are made.

CHOWBENT AND ATHERTON.

CHOWBENT is a thriving village in the chapelry of Atherton, and parish of Leigh, situated on an elevated position on the high road from Leigh to Bolton, 12 miles west by north from Manchester, 26 east, north-east from Liverpool, 13 north-north-east from Warrington, 7 east by south from Wigan, $2\frac{1}{2}$ from Leigh, and 5 south from Bolton. Cotton spinning is extensively carried on by two companies, established on the limited liability principle, as well as by several other firms, which afford employment for a large proportion of the inhabitants. The manufacture of nails has flourished here for more than a hundred years; the trade suffered a considerable depression consequent on the American war in the earlier portion of the present century. Of late years, however, it has revived, extensive works having been erected for the manufacture of screw bolts, nails, &c. Chowbent was formerly celebrated for the manufacture of machinery for cotton spinning, carding, &c., but this branch of industry is not now carried on. Although several important improvements in machinery originated here, in addition to the most important discovery of the value of the application of heat in certain processes of manufacture of cotton and other

goods. There are two iron foundries. The unlimited supply of coals in the immediate neighbourhood has materially aided in increasing the prosperity of this well-known village. Half-a-mile distant from the village are stations on the London and North Western lines of railway from Bolton to Kenyon, and from Eccles to Wigan, affording communication with Manchester, Liverpool, &c. The places of worship are an Episcopal chapel, dedicated to St. John, the Rev. John Nuttall, M.A. is vicar. A mission church (school) has recently been established at Howe bridge, a mile distant from the village. The Baptists, Wesleyan Methodists, and Unitarians have each chapels here, with day and Sunday schools attached. There are also National schools in connection with the establishment in the village and at Howe bridge. The Cemetery, consecrated and opened for interments by the Bishop of Manchester in 1856, is pleasantly situated on the road to Leigh, half a mile distant from the centre of the village, the grounds contain two chapels for the use of the Established Church and Dissenters. Formerly there was a market held in the village, but latterly this has fallen into disuse. Petty Sessions are held in the Public hall, Bolton new road every alternate Monday. The population of Chowbent is included with Atherton chapelry.

ATHERTON is a chapelry in the parish of Leigh, comprising an area of 2,220 acres. The extensive Atherton collieries of John Fletcher and others are situated in this township. Lord Lilford is the principal landowner. Population of Atherton (including Chowbent), in 1861, 5907; 1871, 7532.

Railway passes through the township, which has been the cause of it being selected as a place of residence by the many opulent merchants and traders of Liverpool, who occupy the elegant mansions and villa residences in this pleasant neighbourhood.

In the village is a brewery and several extensive retail establishments.

The parish Church of St. Michael is a very ancient stone edifice. The late vicar, the Rev. Ellis Ashton, B.D., restored the chancel, and added the stained glass window at the eastern end. There are several other memorial windows, and a carved oak screen of ancient date.

The National Schools for the joint townships of Huyton and Roby are situated near the first-named village.

The Congregationalists (or Independents) have a neat gothic Chapel, with day and Sunday schools attached.

The Roman Catholics have a Chapel in the Park, in connection with which, Schools are about being erected.

A new branch line of Railway from Huyton to St. Helens, &c., has been recently completed.

Population of township in 1861, 1,612; in 1871, 2,542.

Area of the parish, 9,807 statute acres.

TARBOCK is an agricultural township in the parish of Huyton, situated about a mile south of that village. There is a brewery in the township.

KNOWSLEY,

A large township in the parish of Huyton, is principally known as one of the seats of the Earl of Derby.

It is situated about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the Huyton Railway station, and the same distance from Prescott, in the hundred of West Derby, union of Prescott, county-county district of St. Helens.

Knowsley Hall, the princely residence of the Earl of Derby, is situated in a magnificent park, containing an area of 2,000 acres, the whole surrounded by a stone wall. The park contains very extensive pleasure grounds, ornamental waters, and the gardens are laid out with excellent taste.

The Church of St. Mary is a gothic stone edifice, in the form of a Latin cross, with spire.

The living of the annual value of £300, with residence, is a perpetual curacy in the gift of the Earl of Derby.

There are National Schools in connection with the Church.

The population of the township in 1861 was 1,349; in 1871, 1,283. Acreage, 4,750.

LEIGH, BEDFORD, WEST LEIGH, AND PENNINGTON.

Leigh is a market town, formed of portions of the two townships of West Leigh and Pennington, 12 miles W. from Manchester, 23 E.N.E. from Liverpool, 7 from Bolton, 11 from Warrington, 7 from Wigan, and 197 N.W. from London.

The Parish of Leigh comprises the townships of Atherton, Bedford, Pennington, Tyldesley, and West Leigh.

The population, according to the Census of 1871, was—Bedford, 6,610; Pennington, 5,424; and West Leigh, 5,587. Total, 17,621; or a total increase over the Census of 1861 of 1,617.

The area of Bedford is 2,826 statute acres; rateable value in 1871, £16,292 13s. 0d. Pennington, 5,424 acres; rateable value, £14,279 2s. 10d. West Leigh, 1,882 acres; rateable value, £20,989. Total rateable value, £51,560 15s. 10d; total area, 6,190 acres.

The area and population of Atherton and Tyldesley will be found in the directory of each place.

Leigh is excellently situated for manufacturing purposes, the neighbourhood furnishing an abundant supply of coal and water; it has not, however, made such rapid progress as other of the manufacturing towns in the county, though the manufacture of silk and cotton spinning are carried on extensively, the latter employing the major portion of the population.

In the history of inventions connected with manufacturing machinery, this parish claims a high position, as the first spinning jenny was constructed here, by Thomas High, a reed-maker, in 1763; Richard Arkwright, however, improved upon the reedmaker's invention, and eventually secured a large fortune.

Here and in the adjacent township of Bedford are the works of Picksley, Sims & Co., Limited, ironfounders and agricultural implement makers.

There is a newspaper published on Saturdays (the *Leigh Chronicle*), which has an extensive circulation in the town and surrounding districts.

The ancient parish church of St. Mary, having become much delapidated, has been recently

taken down (with the exception of the tower), and is in course of rebuilding; the foundation stone of the new edifice was laid on the 15th May, 1871, by the Lord Bishop of Manchester, with great ceremony, the day being kept as a general holiday in the town: the new church will be in the perpendicular Gothic style of architecture, from the designs of Messrs. Paley and Austin, architects, of Lancaster, and is estimated to cost about £9,000, including repairs to the tower; £7,000 of the amount has been voluntarily subscribed by the parishioners and friends, including a handsome sum from the Sunday School scholars connected with the Church.

The living of Leigh is a discharged vicarage, of the annual value of £270, with residence, in the gift of Lord Lilford. The Rev. James Irvine, M.A., is the vicar. Rev. J. H. Stanning, M.A., curate in charge.

Christ Church, in the township of Pennington, is a beautiful stone edifice, erected in 1853-4, from the design of Mr. Shellard, of Manchester.

The Schools in connection with the churches are well attended.

St. Paul's Church, West Leigh, is a stone building, with national and Sunday schools attached. There is also a Mission Church and Schools, in Firs-lane, in the same township.

The Wesleyan Methodists have recently erected a beautiful Chapel, with spire, at a cost of upwards of £9,000. The Independents, Primitive Methodists, and Quakers, have each places of worship here. There are Schools in connection with the Wesleyan and Independent Chapels.

The Free School, founded and endowed in 1655, by Piers Ranicar, is situated near the parish church. The founder left £6 per annum, chargeable on certain lands, which has since been increased to £25 per annum by various other charitable donors.

The Cemetery, established under the Burials Acts by the joint townships of Astley, Bedford, Pennington, and West Leigh, at a cost of upwards of £7,000, comprises about 11 acres of land, with three mortuary chapels, for the separate use of the established church, dissenters, and roman catholics.

The Leigh Poor-law Union and County Court districts comprises the townships of Astley, Atherton, Bedford, Culcheth, Golborne, Kenyon, Lowton, Pennington, Tyldesley-with-Shacklery, and West Leigh.

The County Court is held at the Town Hall. The magistrates hold petty sessions at Leigh and Chowbent every alternate Monday. The central office for the Warrington division of the county Constabulary is at the Town Hall, Leigh.

Two branches from the London and North Western Railway pass near the town from Kenyon Junction to Bolton and Wigan, Tyldesley, Eccles, and Manchester. A branch from Wigan of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, joining the Duke of Bridgewater's Canal, passes through the town.

BEDFORD is a populous and flourishing township, immediately adjoining and in the parish of Leigh, and may be considered as forming a suburb or part of that town. Here are several large cotton and silk mills, and one of the foundries of Picksley, Sims & Co., Limited, which employs a large number of hands, and has added much to the prosperity of the immediate neighbourhood.

There are also several breweries. The Bedford Brewing and Malting Company's premises are in this township.

The Railway Station here is named "Bedford Leigh," and is on the Kenyon branch of the Eccles, Tyldesley and Wigan section of the London and North Western Railway.

LOWTON

Is a parish and township containing 1,830 statute acres and a population in 1871 of 2,144. The rateable value of the township in 1871 was £7,437 15s. 0d. It is situated 4 miles from Leigh, 2 miles north-east from Newton-in-Makerfield, and 7 north from Warrington. The nearest railway station is at Golborne, about a mile distant from the village. The principal portion of the inhabitants are engaged in agriculture. There is one cotton mill about to resume operations; it has been re-built, having been recently burned down.

The Parish Church, dedicated to St. Luke, is a brick and stone edifice. The living, of the annual value of £250, is in the gift of the Earl of Derby. The rector is the Rev. Thomas Forster, M.A.

The district Church on Lowton Common, dedicated to St. Mary, is a neat stone building in the early English style of architecture. The living is a perpetual curacy; annual value, £50, with residence. The Rev. J. W. S. Simpson, M.A., is the present vicar.

There are also places of Worship in the township for the Wesleyans and Primitive Methodists. There are National Schools attached to the Churches and Sunday Schools to each place of worship.

Lowton is included in the Union and County Court district of Leigh. Byrom Hall, formerly in the possession of a family of that name in the township, is a brick building of the 17th century, now occupied as a farm-house. Lowton Hall, erected about the same period, is a mansion of similar construction, also in the occupation of a farmer.

NEWTON-LE-WILLOWS,

Or, Newton-in-Makerfield is a parish and town in the hundred of West Derby, six miles north of Warrington, and seven south of Wigan.

There is an extensive paper manufactory here, and the railway printing and stationery works of Messrs. McCorquodale & Co. Newton formerly returned two members to Parliament, but was disfranchised by the Reform Bill.

The London and North Western line of railway between Liverpool and Manchester passes through the parish, the station being equi-distant from those towns. The line, a short distance to the west of Newton, is carried over a valley and the Sankey canal by a lofty viaduct, supported by nine arches.

The Liverpool Farm Reformatory School, an excellently conducted institution for the reformation of juvenile criminals, is situated on the road to Warrington, a short distance from the railway station.

The Church of St. Peter, erected at the expense of Richard Legh, Esq., in 1682, and since rebuilt, is a neat stone edifice situated with a frontage to the principal street of the town. The lord of the manor, Wm. J. Legh, Esq., a descendant of the founder is the patron of the living.

The Parish Church, a neat stone edifice with spire, is situated at Wargreave Moss. It was erected in 1842. The living, a rectory, is in the gift of the Earl of Derby. Newton was formerly in the parish of Winwick, but created into a distinct parish by Act of Parliament in 1845. St. Peter's district schools are erected to accommodate about 320 children. These extensive schools possess considerable architectural beauty, and the internal arrangements are well adapted for the system of education as followed in our national schools. A residence for the master and mistress is attached to the schools.

There are places of worship for Independents and Roman Catholics, and Sunday Schools attached to each place.

The Grammar School here possesses an endowment of £50 per annum, under the patronage of W. J. Legh, Esq.

Haydock Lodge, a beautifully situated mansion, formerly the residence of the Legh family, is now occupied as a Private Asylum for the reception and recovery of insane patients. The system of treatment pursued at this establishment has been highly successful. The extensive grounds for the exercise and recreation of the patients are tastefully laid out.

The Red Bank, near Newton, is noted as the place where a party of Highlanders in their march from Preston in 1648 were defeated by detachments of Cromwell's Army, who hung the greater part of their prisoners in a field which retains the name of "Gallows Croft."

An old hall here is an object of attention to the stranger; it is built principally of wood, with stained glass windows. The rock in the rear of it has been hollowed out in a curious manner.

Formerly a market was held in the town, but it has been discontinued for a considerable length of time. The obelisk, which marked the site of the Ancient Cross, has lately been removed to Earlestown. Fairs are held for cattle and horses on the 17th May, August 11th for cattle, and August 12th for horses.

Acreage, 2692; population, 1861, 5909; 1871, —

EARLESTOWN is a village about a mile west from Newton-le-Willows, and rapidly increasing in population and importance, owing principally to the establishment of the London and North-Western Railway Company's Waggon Works, employing upwards of 800 men. Near Earlestown are the Vulcan Locomotive Engine Works, extensive sugar works, oil and paper mills, and an iron foundry. The village now contains many excellent retail establishments, and a market is being established in this flourishing place, which 18 years ago contained only 20 houses.

Divine service in connection with the Established Church is held in the National School. The Wesleyans have also a place of worship here.

ORFORD

Is a Hamlet, in the township and parish of and about a mile and a half from Warrington, but in the ecclesiastical district of Padgate; in the hundred of west Derby, and Warrington union. Orford Hall was formerly the residence of John Ireland Blackburne, Esq., to whose memory a monument has been erected in Orford lane, opposite to the entrance to the Hall, bearing the following inscription "In honour of John I. Blackburne, Esq., who died at Orford hall, 20th December, 1786, aged 93 years; a benefactor of Orford, a great botanist, and a christian gentleman, who looked up through nature to nature's God." Schools have been built, and since their erection they have been considerably enlarged; they are invested in trustees for the benefit of the village and neighbourhood; the school-room has been licensed, and divine service is performed every Sunday morning and evening by the Rev. E. J. Willcocks, B.A., curate, appointed by the incumbent of Padgate. Population in 1871, 3186.

Is a part of Padgate, and an ecclesiastical district, in the hundred of West Derby, Warrington union, and county-court district; situated on the old road from Warrington to Bolton, and about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the Warrington Railway Station.

The population in 1861 was 672, and in 1871, 687. The area is 1,233 acres. The soil in the northern part of the township is clayey, and in the southern part alluvial on sand. The chief crops are wheat and potatoes.

Christ Church is a plain brick building, with one bell. The living is a perpetual curacy, annual value £115, with residence, in the gift of the rector of Warrington; the Rev. Arthur Alexander Bridgman, M.A., is the present vicar.

There is an endowed national school for boys and girls.

Here is a Wesleyan chapel with schools.

The great tithes belong to Warwick Hospital. Warwick, and the small tithes to the rector of Warrington.

FEARNHEAD and POULTON are each townships, united for all purposes except one, which is the maintenance of the roads. Each township keeps up its own roads.

PRESCOT

Is an ancient market town and parish, eight miles from Liverpool, 28 from Manchester, and 10 from Warrington.

Prescot is celebrated principally for its manufacture of watch movements and hands, and all kinds of tools for watchmakers and jewellers. Small files of great excellence are also made here, and have attained a world wide celebrity for their superior qualities.

There are extensive retail establishments, also two breweries in the town, and manufactories of coarse earthenware in the immediate neighbourhood.

Prescot has not had the benefit of a railway communication until the construction of a branch from the Manchester and Liverpool line at Huyton to St. Helens in the present year, and about being opened, which it is hoped will give an impetus to the general trade of the town, which of late years has not increased as rapidly as might be wished. A newspaper *The Prescot Reporter* is published here on Saturday.

Petty Sessions for the Prescot division are held in the new Court-room, Derby-street, on the first and third Tuesday in each month; and at the Town hall, St. Helens, every Monday.

The Market days are Tuesday and Saturday, and fortnightly fairs are held for cattle from Shrove Tuesday to the first Tuesday in May, and the annual fairs on Ash Wednesday, Wednesday after Corpus Christi, August 24th and 25th, October 21st, and November 1st.

A court leet held annually on Corpus Christi, when a coroner for the manor and liberty is appointed.

The provost and scholars of King's College, Cambridge, are lords of the manor.

Prescot is in the County Court district of St. Helens.

The Parish Church of St. Mary is an ancient stone structure with tower and spire 156 feet in height. The church contains several monuments, one particularly worthy of notice, to the late William Atherton, Esq.

The living is a vicarage in the patronage of the lords of the manor. The Independents, Wesleyans, and Roman Catholics, have each places of Worship here. There are National and Sunday schools.

There are several alm-houses, well endowed by Oliver Lyme, Esq., in 1708; Rev. Samuel Sewell, in 1830; and Miss Eleanor Atherton, in 1861. The free school, which educates about fifty boys, was originally supported by parochial rates, since the ceasing of which (about a century ago), several benefactions have continued to maintain the establishment.

By an act of Parliament obtained in 1867, the local affairs of the town are managed by a Board, who have many improvements of a sanitary nature in hand. Several streets have been re-named and numbered; one formerly Hillock-street has received the name of Kemble Street, in honor of the great actor of that name who was born in it.

The watch movements, &c., trades have received a considerable impetus during the past 12 months, owing to the Continental war, which has disarranged those branches of industry in France and Germany. One establishment here is now undergoing considerable enlargement to accommodate the increasing demand.

The population of Prescott, according to the census taken on 2nd April, 1871, was 5077 (this includes all residents within the boundary as fixed by the Local Act of 1867).

ST. HELENS, ECCLESTON, PARR, SUTTON, WINDLE.

St. Helens, the principal seat of glass manufacture in the United Kingdom, is a municipal borough and market town, situated 12 miles E. by N. from Liverpool, 21 W. by S. from Manchester, $20\frac{1}{4}$ N.W. from London, $88\frac{3}{4}$ from Birmingham, 9 S.W. from Wigan, $10\frac{1}{2}$ W. from Warrington and $30\frac{3}{4}$ S.W. from Preston. It is a station on a branch of the London and North-Western line of railway, which affords facilities of communication with the adjacent towns and all parts of the kingdom. A line recently constructed from Huyton to St. Helens forms a direct route from Liverpool to St. Helens and the north.

The town, formerly a village of little importance, is the seat of various branches of industry. First in importance are the works for the manufacture of crown, plate, and flint glass and bottles. The several joint stock companies and private firms engaged in the trade have very extensive premises, covering large areas, and employ a large proportion of the population. The manufactories here produce plates of glass of enormous size, clearness and perfection, fully equalling the productions of France or Venice.

In the town and its immediate neighbourhood are extensive chemical works. Copper smelting is largely carried on, and the manufacture of earthenware sewage pipes, terra cotta,

fire bricks, and fire clay goods of all kinds is also an important branch of industry. There are also several iron and brass foundries and engineering establishments, breweries, works for the manufacture of hemp, steel, and wire ropes. The district affords an abundant supply of excellent coal, which, together with its proximity to Liverpool, and the railway and canal accommodation, affording facilities for the conveyance of minerals and manufactures, have materially aided the progress of this important town. Two newspapers are published here: the *St. Helens* newspaper and advertiser on Tuesday and Saturday, and the *St. Helens Standard* on Saturday. An Athenæum has been established in Hardshaw Street, and is well supported. Mr. J. B. Leach is secretary to the institution. The Town Hall, in the New Market Place, has recently suffered from fire, and it is proposed to have it rebuilt. The Public Library, containing several thousand volumes, is at present located in temporary premises.

The Churches of the Establishment are St. Mary's, in Church Street, a brick building containing a beautiful stained glass memorial window, the gift of Richard Fildes, a gentleman of the town, and one in memory of Mr. Penketh, given by a surviving member of the family.

St. Thomas' Church, Peter Street, is situated in the midst of a populous district.

Holy Trinity Church, Traverse Street, is in a thickly inhabited portion of Parr, one of the suburbs of the town.

A district church has also been recently erected at Ravenhead.

There are National and Sunday Schools in connection with each of the churches.

The various dissenting denominations having places of worship here are the Independents (or Congregationalists), the English Presbyterians, Wesleyan Methodists, Primitive Methodists, the United Methodist Free Church, and the Roman Catholics.

Cowley's British Schools, in connection with the Independent Chapel, are largely endowed, and are ably conducted by Mr. Newton Lacey.

The Roman Catholics have large schools at Lowe House, Ravenhead Passage, and Peasley Cross, as well as Ragged Schools in the poorer district near Liverpool Road. The ladies of the convents conduct the education of the girls in the various schools.

At Blackbrook, about a mile from St. Helens, a Reformatory for Catholic girls has been established, under the superintendence of the Sisters of Mercy.

A charter of incorporation having been obtained on the 30th January, 1868, St. Helens is now a municipal borough, including the whole townships of Sutton and Parr, a portion of Eccleston, including St. Ann's, and so far in Windle as to include Cowley Hill and a cluster of houses known as the "City." Total area of the borough, 6,558 acres.

The jurisdiction of the County Court of St. Helens extends over the townships of Windle, Windle-with-Hardshaw, Eccleston, Parr, Sutton, Bold, Rainhill, Prescott, Widnes, Widnes-with-Appleton, Cronton, Ditton, Hale, Halewood, Speke, Little Woolton, Much Woolton, Huyton, Roby, Knowsley, Whiston, Rainford, and Tarbock. The courts are held fortnightly, in the Court Room, East Street, St. Helens.

Courts Leet and Baron for Windle are held annually by Sir Robert T. Gerard, Lord of the Manor, and peace officers are appointed for the district.

The market is held on Saturday, and the fairs on the first Tuesday after Easter and the Saturday following September 11th. Population of the borough in 1871, 45,216.

PARR is a township in the parish of Prescott, and forming part of the municipal borough of St. Helens. The church, dedicated to St. Peter, is a neat stone structure, recently erected (the former edifice having been destroyed by fire). The living is a perpetual curacy. The Rev. Abraham A. Nunn, M.A., is the vicar. Here are copper works, collieries, and large chemical works. Population in 1861, 8,253; in 1871, 9,258. Area, 1,601 acres.

SUTTON is a parish forming an important part of the municipal borough of St. Helens, as previously stated. The church, dedicated to St. Nicholas, is a stone edifice in the Gothic order of architecture. The living, a vicarage of the annual value of £716, is in the gift of King's College, Cambridge. The Rev. Henry Edward Francis Vallancy, M.A., is the vicar.

The Independents, Wesleyans, and Roman Catholics have each chapels here. There are National Schools and schools in connection with each of the Roman Catholic Chapels. There is a monastery of the Order of Passionists in the township.

Manufactures, &c., are as mentioned under St. Helens. The Liverpool and Manchester

section and St. Helens branches of the London and North-Western Railway run through the township. There are stations at St. Helens Junction, Sutton Oak, and Lea Green.

Population: 1861, 4,071; 1871 (including 756 in the asylum near Rainhill) 10,905. Area, 1,181 acres.

WINDLE is a township, part of which is comprised in St. Helens municipal borough. The Cemetery is a beautiful place of interment, near the old Windleshaw Abbey. Population: 1861, 12,259; 1871, 15,011. Acreage, 2,907.

ECCLESTON is a township extending from St. Helens to Prescot, and similarly situated to Sutton. The township contains stone quarries, potteries, &c., and the manufacture of watch movements employs a portion of the inhabitants. Population: 1861, 11,640; and in 1871 (in the borough of St. Helens), 11,194. Acreage, 3,387.

TYLDESLEY WITH SHACKERLEY

Is a populous village (or town), in the parish of Leigh, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles east-north-east therefrom, 5 south-west from Bolton, 11 north-west from Manchester, and 199 from London.

The township comprises an area of 2,489 statute acres, the gross estimated rental is £32,095 14s.; the rateable value £26,332 5s. 0d., the population in 1841 amounted to 4,721 in 1851 5,398, in 1861 6,029, and in 1871 to 6,408.

It is in West Derby hundred, Leigh union and county court district, Manchester diocese. The church of St. George, was erected in 1825, by the Church Building Commissioners. It is a handsome stone edifice in the the early pointed Gothic style of architecture, with lofty spire, clock, and a fine peal of 6 bells. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the gift of Lord Lilford; the Rev. George Richards, M.A., of Trinity College, Cambridge, is the vicar.

The Independents, Wesleyans, the Countess of Huntingdon's connexion, and Roman Catholics have each chapels here in connection with which are schools. There is also a National School for boys and girls.

There are several large cotton spinning mills, and collieries in the district, the coal obtained from these mines is highly appreciated for its excellent qualities.

A branch of the London and North Western Companies line passes through the township and has a station here.

Hindsford in the township of Atherton is immediately adjoining, and in the postal district of Tyldesley, here are cotton mills, an ironfoundry, &c.

WIDNES AND APPLETON

Is a joint township in the parish of Prescott, situated on the banks of the river Mersey, intersected by the St. Helens section of the London and North-Western Railways and the Sankey canal, six miles west by east from Warrington, five miles south from Prescott, and 13 south-east from Liverpool, in the hundred of West Derby, county court district of St. Helens, archdeaconry of Liverpool, and diocese of Chester. Here are very extensive chemical works, copper smelting works, soap works, locomotive and wagon grease works, oil and paint manufacturers, iron foundries, &c. Every facility is afforded for the transmission of the articles manufactured, and the conveyance of the raw material used in the different works both by water and rail. A magnificent bridge, known as the "Tullers Girder," spans the river Mersey here, linking together the counties of Lancashire and Cheshire. It was constructed by the London and North-Western Railway Company, their object being to effect a quicker route from Liverpool to London. The bridge proper is 1,800 feet long, consisting of three river openings 305 feet each. Altogether there are 101 arches. The width between the girders for the railway is 25 feet; the height of the girders above high-water mark is 75 feet, and the height of the lattice girders is 27 feet. The top of the towers above high-water mark is 128 feet. There is also provision made for foot passengers, there being a footpath six feet wide. 5,100 tons of iron was consumed in the construction of this bridge. The contractors were Messrs. Brassey and Ogilvie. W. Baker, Esq., was the chief engineer. This gigantic undertaking occupied about five years in its construction. The church, a stone edifice, was erected in 1856. The Wesleyans and Roman Catholics have each chapels, and there are day and Sunday schools here.

WOODEND, UPTON.—Hanging Birch and Lunts Heath are in this township.

APPLETON is a village one mile from Widnes, and the same distance from Farnworth, and is a station on the St. Helens and Liverpool branch of the London and North-Western Railway. Here is a spacious Roman Catholic chapel, in the early English style of architecture. It was erected in 1847, at a cost of £4,000. There are day and Sunday schools connected with it.

FARNWORTH is a village in the township of Widnes, and parish of Prescott, from which it is distant five miles south-east and five and-a-half west from Warrington. The church, dedicated to St. Luke, is an ancient stone edifice. The register dates from 1538. The living is a perpetual curacy in the gift of the Vicar of Prescott. The grammar school was founded and endowed by the Right Rev. Dr. Smythe, Bishop of Lincoln, in the reign of Henry VIII. The population of Farnworth and Widnes, in 1861, was 8,879, and, in 1871, 16,848.

DITTON is a township in the parish and Union of Prescott, and county court district of Farnworth, and is a station on the St. Helens, Warrington, and Liverpool lines of Railway. A large free school has been erected here by the Hon. Mrs. Stapleton for the education of the

poor children of the parish, irrespective of creed, and is conducted by the Sisters of the Order of St. Paul.

HOUGH GREEN is a hamlet, in the township.

Halewood is a hamlet in the parish of Prescot, five miles from Widnes.

WINWICK WITH HULME

Is a parish and joint township 3 miles north from Warrington, situated on the turnpike road from Warrington to Newton-in-Makerfield, from the latter it is distant about 2 miles. The township comprises an area of 1,431 statute acres, the rector is Lord of the Manor, the population in 1861 was 451, and in 1871 456. It is in the hundred of West Derby, union County Court district, and rural deanery of Warrington, archdeaconry of Liverpool and diocese of Chester.

The church of St. Oswald is an ancient stone edifice, and existed before the Norman invasion; the body of the building is large and irregular, and of various styles of architecture, with tower surmounted by an octagonal spire, and a peal of six bells, a new chancel was added to the church in 1847, as is thus recorded on a plate on the North wall. "This chancel impaired by time and injured in the great rebellion, was rebuilt on its old foundations, and restored to its original form, in more than its original beauty in 1847-8; it underwent considerable alterations in 1858, at a cost of nearly £2000; the rector, the Rev. Frank George Hopwood, and Robert Atherton Hornby, Esq., contributing the principal part. It is fitted with oak stalls adorned with carving in wood and stone, and the arched roof of oak is beautifully illuminated. All the windows of the chancel are of stained glass, the western window is filled with stained glass as a memorial of the late rector. There are several

monuments to the families of Lēgh and Hornby, also a font, clock, and painted windows, three brasses, two of them to the Leghs, of Lyme and one to the Gerards of Bryn, there is a small obituary window to James seventh Earl of Derby. The Church spire (supposed to have been damaged by lightning), was repaired in 1870 at a cost of about £150. The register dates from 1563. The living is a rectory, in the gift of the Earl of Derby; the Rev. Frank George Hopwood, M.A., of Christ Church, Oxford, is the rector. The Grammar school was founded in 1618 by Gualter Legh, who endowed it with the yearly income of £10, which, by subsequent benefactions, was increased to £34. The Rev. Samuel Burnell, M.A., of Queen's College, Cambridge, is principal. There are Church schools for boys and girls, supported by the rector, average attendance about 90, and there is a Sunday School held at the boys and girls school.

Hulme is a hamlet about half a mile north from Winwick.
